

OBJECTIVE

The Fund seeks to maximize total return in a manner consistent with the generation of current income, preservation of capital and reduced price volatility.

STRATEGY

The Fund invests at least 80% of its assets in fixed-income securities including U.S. Treasury and government-agency bonds, corporate bonds, mortgage- and asset-backed securities and other debt obligations. The Adviser selects securities based on its longer-term view of the economic cycle, relative value analysis among and within sectors, and issuer-specific factors. The Fund seeks to be diversified across sectors and will invest predominantly in investment grade debt securities.

FUND ADVISER

The Fund's Adviser is Tributary Capital Management, LLC ("Tributary"), a wholly-owned subsidiary of First National of Nebraska, Inc. Tributary is headquartered in Omaha, Nebraska. Tributary is a SEC registered investment adviser and provides investment advisory services to individuals, investment companies and other institutions. As of June 30, 2026, Tributary had \$4.6 billion in firm assets.

First National Advisers, a division of First National Bank, serves as the Fund's Sub-adviser.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

Short- or intermediate-term investment grade bonds offer less risk and generally a lower rate of return than longer-term higher yielding bonds. The Fund is subject to the risk that principal value reacts in opposition to the movement of interest rates and that a rising interest rate environment increases the risk of loss of principal. Fixed income is subject to credit risk, market risk, interest rate risk and prepayment risk. The Fund's share price and yield will be affected by interest rate movements, with bond prices generally moving in the opposite direction from interest rates. Credit risk refers to the bond issuers ability to make timely payments of principal and interest.

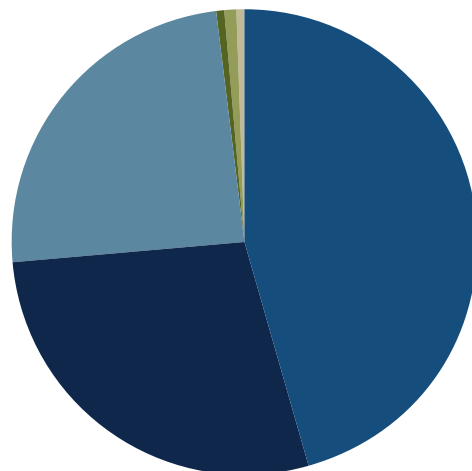

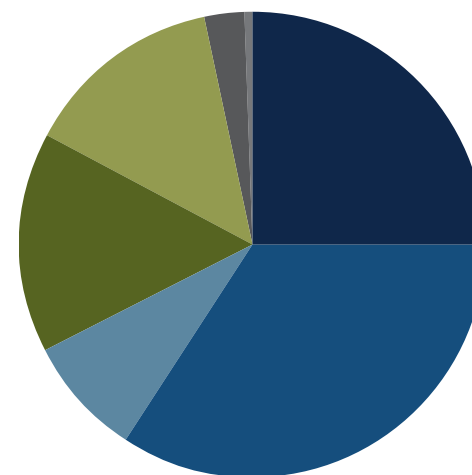

¹ Bloomberg Barclays U.S. Aggregate Bond Index is an unmanaged index and covers the USD-denominated, investment-grade, fixed-rate, taxable bond market of SEC-registered securities. The index includes bonds from the Treasury, Government-Related, Corporate, MBS (agency fixed-rate and hybrid ARM passthroughs), ABS and CMBS sectors. The index does not reflect the fees and expenses associated with a mutual fund. Investors cannot invest directly in an index. Effective August 29, 2024, the Fund changed its primary benchmark index from the Bloomberg Barclays 1-3 Year US Government/Credit Index to the Bloomberg Barclays U.S. Aggregate Bond Index due to regulatory requirements. The Fund retained the Bloomberg Barclays 1-3 Year US Government/Credit Index as a secondary benchmark index because the Bloomberg Barclays 1-3 Year US Government/Credit Index more closely reflects the market sectors in which the Fund invests.

² Bloomberg Barclays 1-3 Year Government/Credit Index is a broad based benchmark that measures the non-securitized component of the US Aggregate Index. The index does not reflect the fees and expenses associated with a mutual fund. Investors cannot invest directly in an index.

³ Investment performance reflects contractual fee waivers in effect through August 1, 2026. Without these fee waivers, the performance would have been lower.

⁴ The Fund's Adviser is voluntarily reimbursing a portion of the Fund's expenses through August 1, 2026. If the Adviser had not reimbursed such expenses, the SEC 30-Day Yield would have been 3.20%. The SEC 30-Day Yield calculation represents net investment income earned by the Fund over the 30-day period ending on the date shown above, expressed as an annual percentage rate based on the Fund's share price at the end of the 30-day period. A subsidized 30-day yield reflects fee waivers and/or expense reimbursements during the period while an unsubsidized figure does not adjust for waivers or reimbursements.

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The Overall Morningstar Rating[™] for a fund is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its three-, five- and ten-year (if applicable) Morningstar Rating[™] metrics. The Morningstar Rating[™] for funds, or "star rating", is calculated for managed products (including mutual funds, variable annuity and variable life subaccounts, exchange-traded funds, closed-end funds, and separate accounts) with at least a three-year history. Exchange-traded funds and open-ended mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The Morningstar Rating does not include any adjustment for sales loads. The top 10% of products in each product category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 35% receive 3 stars, the next 22.5% receive 2 stars, and the bottom 10% receive 1 star. The Overall Morningstar Rating for a managed product is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its three-, five-, and 10-year (if applicable) Morningstar Rating metrics. The weights are: 100% three-year rating for 36-59 months of total returns, 60% five-year rating/40% three-year rating for 60-119 months of total returns, and 50% 10-year rating/30% five-year rating/20% three-year rating for 120 or more months of total returns. While the 10-year overall star rating formula seems to give the most weight to the 10-year period, the most recent three-year period actually has the greatest impact because it is included in all three rating periods. For the period ended June 30, 2026, the Fund received 3, 3 and 3 stars out of 517, 488 and 379 Short-Term Bond funds for the three-, five- and ten-year periods, respectively. The Morningstar Rating is for the Institutional share class only; other classes may have different performance characteristics.
